### Course #2—Constructing Christian Education in Small Congregations



The Rev. Dr. Sara Covin Juengst, minister and Certified Christian Educator has served as a local church educator, overseas missionary, campus minister, General Assembly staff associate, Director of Continuing Education at Columbia Theological Seminary and as a Director of Christian Education for a cluster of 6 small churches.

Dr. Juengst is the author of numerous articles and curricula, and eight books, including *Breaking Bread: Sharing Faith with Children; Like a Garden; Green Fields; Jesus as Teacher and Equipping the Saints: Teacher Training in the Church*. In 1996, she was given a Life Achievement Award by the Association of Presbyterian Christian Educators, honoring her contributions to the field of Christian Education. She is currently the supply pastor of a small church in Lincolnton, GA.



The Rev. Dr. Pamela Ann Morgan, minister and Educator has served as a pastor, faculty at the University of Houston, and currently is the Dean of The Institute for Pastoral Studies. She served six years as a Pastor to a small Native American congregation.

Dr. Morgan is the author of numerous articles, web related learning materials, web sites and is a known lecturer in the application of constructivist education.
